ORGANISATION

- The original extension to scope application was received by QLD Department of Education and Training (DET) but was not approved by the DET regulator prior to transition. The organisation was informed of this and the application was passed to ASQA for consideration.
- The organisation has two applications to be considered. Risk assessment by ASQA required an audit be conducted.
- As the applications were received prior to the organisation participating in a post initial audit, business rules determined a desk audit of evidence was to be conducted.
- Initial desk evidence was received by ASQA on 27 August 2012.
- Subsequent to this on 30 October 2012 the organisation provided examples of assessment tools for each of the qualifications listed on the application for review.
- The organisation intends to establish a partnership agreement with L2 Project Management for the delivery of training and assessment for qualifications from the RIIO9 training package. A simulated workplace will be utilised for the delivery of the remaining qualifications and units of competency listed on the applications.
- Core clients / target groups for will be clients wishing to or already working in the applicable industry area.
- For qualifications from the RII09 training package delivery venues will be various regional mine sites. The remainder of the qualifications listed on the applications will be delivered in Yeppoon.
- Fee revenue sources will be on a fee for service basis.

Audit Findings

The organisation demonstrated compliance with **Standard for NVR Registered Training Organisations (SNR) - Essential Standards for Continuing Registration 16**.

The organisation did not demonstrate compliance with **SNR 15** and **SNR 17** for the qualifications/unit of competency in the audit scope. As a consequence the organisation is not compliant with **SNR 18**. The non-compliance was seen as significant due to deficiencies in the training and assessment strategies, deficiencies in processes to access appropriate physical and human resources within the mining sector and deficiencies in the assessment materials indicating a potentially serious adverse impact on learners and/or persons affected by the outcomes of the training and assessment service provided.

For the above qualifications two cohorts were identified those working in industry and those not working in the mining industry. The strategy referenced work placement as part of the delivery. Insufficient evidence of how work placement activities will be conducted to ensure client needs are addressed for those not already working in an appropriate workplace. Furthermore, the organisation is to provide evidence to demonstrate processes are in place that will ensure the applicable work placement/vocational placement agreements, appropriate insurances and procedures are put in place for this to occur, depending in which state this is required.

Furthermore, the RTO did not provide evidence to demonstrate that there are adequate processes in place to ensure the facilities and equipment are safe, operational and industry relevant.

Assessment tools examined for the above units of competency do not fully address the requirements of the RII09 training package. While some of the knowledge requirements had been addressed insufficient evidence was provided to demonstrate assessment is conducted in accordance with the principles of assessment and the rules of evidence. For example, insufficient evidence was provided to demonstrate the practical assessment tools which included oral questioning to confirm application of knowledge for each of the above units of competency are supported by or include guidance for assessors about how to measure competence and the performance level required to ensure, validity, reliability and sufficiency of assessment across a range of assessors and learners.

Insufficient evidence was provided to demonstrate that agreements are in place with each organisation that provides training and/or assessment on the RTO's behalf. Even though the unsigned agreement template provided as evidence has listed some responsibilities of the parties involved it has not provided sufficient detail of the management strategies to be implemented, including monitoring arrangements that will ensure that the agreement is adhered to by all parties and that improvements are made, where required to ensure the organisation complies with all aspects of the VET Quality Framework.

The organisation is not compliant with SNR 18 as the Chief Executive of the organisation has not ensured the NVR registered training organisation complies with the VET Quality Framework.

- Partnership Agreement Memorandum of Understanding documenting the intention, scope and parameters of the proposed partnership between the organisation and L2 Project Management

Analysis of the evidence demonstrates that the organisation has established strategies and processes for monitoring training and assessment to ensure compliance with the VET Quality Framework, in accordance with the requirements of the Standard.

The organisation has provided an assessment plan, assessor guide, revised assessment tools and mapping document for each of the above units of competency.

Instructions in the Assessor Guide suggest that the Practical Assessment Tools are to be used to gather evidence of the candidate's competence against the practical aspects of the units.

Parts of the Practical Assessment Tool for each unit require the assessor to either observe or have the candidate explain aspects of performance that necessarily need to be observed in order to gather valid evidence of the candidate's competence against the practical aspects of the unit. As an example only:

- For unit RIIBLA205A a learner can either demonstrate or explain their ability to transport explosives
- For unit RIBLA201A, a learner can either demonstrate or explain their ability to prime and load blast holes

Consequently, the option to have the learner merely 'explain' aspects of the unit could lead to gaps in the assessment of all required skills and critical aspects of evidence as set out in the unit's requirements. This would lead to assessment that did not gather valid or reliable evidence of competence in accordance with the rules of evidence.

The organisation has provided an assessment plan, assessor guide, revised assessment tools and mapping document for each of the above units of competency.

It is unclear in some parts of the Practical Assessment Tools for these units whether the assessor is required to observe the candidate demonstrating <u>and</u> explaining particular tasks – or whether it is acceptable for the candidate to simply demonstrate <u>or</u> explain how to perform the particular tasks. Specifically, the performance level required of candidates for assessment cannot be reliably ascertained where the instruction to assessors is that 'The candidate is to be observed demonstrating/explaining the following ...'; or where the instruction to assessors is that 'The candidate is to demonstrate and/or explain ...'

Therefore, it cannot be confirmed, that the assessment would gather valid and reliable evidence of competency, in accordance with unit requirements, and across a range of learners and assessors.

The organisation has provided an assessment plan, assessor guide, revised assessment tools and mapping document for this unit of competency.

Instructions in the Assessor Guide suggest that the Practical Assessment Tool is to be used to gather evidence of the candidate's competence against the practical aspects of the unit, as detailed in the assessment plan.

Analysis of the evidence has determined that the performance level requirements specified in parts of the revised practical assessment tool are inconsistent with the tasks required to be demonstrated. As an example only, the assessment plan (and performance criterion 2.1 of the unit of competency) requires that the candidate carry out pre-start checks and demonstrate start-up, park-up and shutdown procedures - yet the Practical Assessment Tool appears to only gathers evidence about whether or not the candidate can satisfactorily 'identify/explain' features of equipment and the processes involved in the task of operating a scraper.

Therefore, it cannot be confirmed that the assessment would gather valid and reliable evidence of competence in accordance with unit requirements.

The organisation has provided an assessment plan, assessor guide, revised assessment tools and mapping document for the above unit of competency.

Analysis of evidence has determined that the tasks listed in the assessment plan do not cover the performance needed to demonstrate achievement of the essential outcomes of the unit. The tasks identified in the assessment plan also do not clearly align with the tasks required to be observed as outlined in the Practical Assessment Tool checklist for the unit. Consequently it could not be confirmed that evidence gathered by the assessor would be directly relevant to the unit's requirements

Further, insufficient evidence has been provided that the organisation has all of the resources for assessment specified in the training package for this unit - which specifically include a bank of scenarios/case studies/ what ifs, in addition to a bank of questions to be used to probe the reasoning behind the observable actions - as required to meet the critical aspects for assessment and evidence required to demonstrate competency in this unit.

The organisation has provided an assessment plan, assessor guide, revised assessment tools and mapping document for each of the above units of competency.

Analysis of evidence has determined that the tasks listed in the units' assessment plans do not cover the performance needed to demonstrate achievement of the essential outcomes of the units. Further, the tasks identified in each unit's assessment plan do not clearly align with the tasks required to be observed as outlined in the corresponding Practical Assessment Tool checklist for the unit. Consequently it could not be confirmed that evidence gathered by the assessor would be directly relevant to each respective unit's requirements.

Review of the theory assessment tools for both units found that they do not assess the required knowledge for the units at a level appropriate to the qualification, being AQF level 5.

Therefore, it is determined that insufficient evidence has been provided to demonstrate that the assessment tools provided for the above units validly assess the skills, knowledge and performance requirements specified in the training package.

SITHFAB009A Provide responsible service of alcohol

The organisation has provided an assessor guide, revised assessment tools and mapping document for this unit of competency.

Analysis of evidence has determined that insufficient information has been provided for assessors regarding the context of

the practical assessment for this unit (including details of the equipment and resources required for assessment), to ensure consistency and reliability in the conduct of assessment across a range of assessors and learners.

SNR 18

As the organisation has outstanding non-compliances in respect of SNR 15, the organisation remains non-compliant with SNR 18 as the Chief Executive of the organisation has not ensured the NVR registered training organisation complies with the VET Quality Framework.

SNR 20

It is noted that this Standard was not previously included in the audit.

However, in reviewing rectification evidence, the Australian Government Crest was found on a number of documents. No evidence was provided to support that the organisation had express permission to use the Crest on its documentation. Consequently, the appearance of the Crest without supporting evidence of permission to use it is a potential breach of Commonwealth legislation.

As the rectification evidence submitted now meets all compliance requirements, the organisation is now also compliant with SNR 18.1.

SNR 20

Review of the rectification evidence presented by the organisation found no documents containing the Australian Government Crest. Therefore it is concluded that the organisation has addressed the previously identified potential breach of Commonwealth legislation.
